




Approach #2: A Facilitated Working Meeting



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

Approach: Focused Conversation (ORID)

- Objective (What) What patterns do you see in the voting?
- Reflective (What do you think about it?) Which initiatives do you like? Where do you have concerns?
- Interpretive (So what?)
 Which initiatives seem to be our top choices? How do they relate?
- Decisional (Now what?)
 Which initiatives will we implement this year?

Results: Commitment to Implement!








